

KCCL Winter League Rules and Guidelines

- I. Shooter Requirements
 - a. A current KCCL Membership is required to participate in the KCCL Winter League
 - i. The membership must be in good standing for the length of Winter League to avoid being dropped from the league.
 - ii. A Winter League Partial Membership will be offered for shooters who do not wish to be full time KCCL members.
 - 1. The Partial Membership is valid from December 1st to March 31st for a total of 4 months.
- II. General League Information
 - a. Each event will consist of 300 Targets
 - b. There will be 12 Weeks total for the league, 1 for every Line
 - i. An early shooting start date will be set prior to Week 1 for shooters to get ahead due to the busy holiday season.
 - ii. Additional days may be allowed at the end of league for shooters to finish unfinished lines. Penalties may apply.
 - 1. Any lines shot after the deadline listed in the schedule will not count towards the league.
 - c. Upon signing up for an event for the league, the shooter will receive a punch card for the event. This punch card is their league card. It will have a total of 12 punches on it, one for each week.
 - i. When the shooter wishes to shoot a registered line they must present the punch card at the front desk to be signed up. The KCCL employee will punch the appropriate week and sign them up on a registered sheet.
 - 1. If a shooter does not present their registered card and have it punched prior to the line going out, it will not be counted as a registered line.
- III. Events
 - a. Skeet
 - i. The event consist of 12 lines/300 Targets
 - ii. 4 lines must be completed by the end of week 4 so that shooters may be classed.
 - 1. There will be a total of 6 classes (AA, A, B, C, D, E)
 - 2. To class shooters, they will be lined up from highest to lowest score out of the 100 targets they shot for the first 4 lines.
 - a. The top 10% of shooters will be listed in AA, and the bottom 10% will be listed in E
 - b. Following the AA shooters, the next 20% will be classified as A, followed the next 20% being B, the next 20% being C, and the next 20% being D.
 - 3. Any shooter who won their class the previous year must at least shoot one class higher than the class they won the previous year.
 - 4. Teams for this event will consist of 5 shooters
 - a. A handicap will be used to determine the final team scores

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- e. Pee Wee
 - i. This event consist of 12 lines/300 Targets
 - 1. All lines must be shot with .410
 - ii. There are no classes for this event
 - iii. There are no teams for this event
 - iv. If there are more than 20 shooters for this event there will be a second flight added.
 - v. All 12 lines must be shot between the start date and finish date of the league
 - 1. Shooters may shoot this event at their leisure, as there are no penalization for falling behind weeks, and may also shoot as far ahead as they want.
- f. Sporting Clays
 - i. This event consist of 6 lines/300 Targets
 - 1. Each line consist of 50 targets.
 - ii. There are no classes for this event.
 - iii. There are no teams for this event.
 - iv. If there are more than 20 shooters for this event there will be a second flight added.
 - v. All 12 lines must be shot between the start date and finish date of the league
 - 1. Shooters may shoot this event at their leisure, as there are no penalization for falling behind weeks, and may also shoot as far ahead as they want.

IV. Sub Classes

- a. There are 4 sub classes that apply to the main Skeet and Trap events.
 - i. Novice
 - 1. The Novice Class is for shooters who have never participated in KCCL's Winter League.
 - ii. Senior
 - 1. The Senior Class is for shooters over the age of 65.
 - iii. Junior
 - 1. The Junior Class is for shooters under the age of 18.
 - iv. Ladies
 - 1. The Ladies class is for all female participants.
